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#### **Program Notes:**

Of Love and Loss was written in memory of the composer's late brother, and communicates loss in a way words fail to express. Violin and piano soloists work with the orchestra to navigate the story of a young man's 2 weeks of life and the impact this life left on those who loved him. The piece gives performers a chance to express a range of emotion through advanced musicality and mature phrasing, gorgeous melodies and lush harmonies.

#### About the music:

This work is dedicated to my late brother, Isaac. His two weeks of life left a profound impact on my own existence, leaving me with fond memories and regrets about the time we spent together. My memory of Isaac has taken many forms in my music, first manifesting as a brass chorale and later as a work for a concert band. Seven years and eight months after his passing, this music asserted itself as a work for string orchestra, solo piano and violin.

#### **Rehearsal Suggestions:**

- The solo parts are not directly representative of Isaac, but the story is incomplete without them. Please rehearse with the soloists as much as possible.
- Soloists and sections should utilize legato style and vibrato where appropriate.
- Please focus efforts to perfect intonation in the E major section of the piece: this portion represents the final minutes of my brother's life.
- In times of stillness, especially at the very end of the piece, the director and ensemble should determine whether vibrato makes sense.
